



Faxing and Its Risks

- 75% of medical communications are still conducted via fax¹
- 8 minutes – Average time spent on managing a fax³
- \$720 – average annual cost of a dedicated phone line for faxing, not including ink, paper, toner, or maintenance²
- Fax machines are highly vulnerable to data breaches, allowing hackers to easily bypass IT firewalls to gain access to practice or patient data⁴

- Information is then scanned into the EHR


Manual workflows lead to:
